

## Harlequin storm Regional Tumbling Prelims

On Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> March, saw Harlequin Gym club take 24 gymnasts to Kingston Gym in Milton Keynes to take part in the Regional Tumbling Prelims where 150 gymnasts took part to fight for their places at the National Semi-Finals.



The morning started with the NATIONAL 1, Women's Tumbling Age 9/10 Age group this was a tough group of 22 gymnasts. Annie Hoskin scored 70.85 placing 18<sup>th</sup>, Lucy Walsh scored 72.40 to be placed 14<sup>th</sup>, Hannah Cladd scored 74.35 to be placed 7<sup>th</sup>, Ruby Perkins scored 74.90 to be placed 4<sup>th</sup> Overall, Ruby Boylett scored 74.95 to be placed 3<sup>rd</sup> claiming the Bronze Medal and Amy Sayell scored 75.65 to be placed in 2<sup>nd</sup> to come home with the Silver Medal.

In National 1, Women's Tumbling Age 11/12 Yrs, another tough group of 22. We had Stella Rowley in this category, she scored 72.00 to be placed 6<sup>th</sup> overall.

In National 2, Age 9/10 Yrs – Ulani Huggins scored 76.10 to be placed 2<sup>nd</sup> taking home the Silver Medal and Darcey Wraight scoring 77.05 to be placed 1<sup>st</sup>, becoming the Age 9/10 Regional Tumble Champion!

In National 2, Men's Tumble age 9/10, Charlie Blaker had a clean sweep scoring 68.10 to bring home the Gold medal and becoming the Men's age 9/10 Regional Champion.

In National 2, Women's Age 11/12, We had Emma Layzell scoring 75.85 placing 3<sup>rd</sup> taking home the bronze medal and Clara Foster scoring 76.90 placing 2<sup>nd</sup> taking the Silver medal home.

In National 2, Men's Age 11/12, Josh Skidmore scoring 73.05 earning him 1<sup>st</sup> place taking the Gold medal and making him the Age 11/12 Regional Champion.

Moving on into the afternoon we had the National 4 gymnasts. Starting the round was the National 4, Women's Age 11/12 Yrs, we had Cassidy Pratt scoring 76.00 placing her 2<sup>nd</sup>, taking home the Silver Medal and Elizabeth Hardie scoring 76.50 placing her 1<sup>st</sup>, giving her the Gold medal and becoming the Women's Age 11/12 Regional Champion.



National 4 Women's Age 13+ Freya Inns scored 70.75 to be placed 6<sup>th</sup> Overall.

In National 4 Men's Age 13+, Enhakorre Obeng scoring 72.40 to be placed 3<sup>rd</sup>, taking the Bronze Medal home.

In National 5, Women's Tumbling Age 10/12 Yrs, Imogen Cook who has moved up 3 levels, scored 75.00 placing her 2<sup>nd</sup> taking home the Silver medal, and Caitlin Garbutt scoring 78.15 placing 1<sup>st</sup> overall taking the Gold medal home and being named Women's National 5 Age 10/15 Regional Champion.



In National 5, Men's Tumbling Age 10/12 Yrs, Aston Fairbanks scoring 74.70 placing him 1<sup>st</sup> taking the Gold medal home and claiming the title of National 5 Men's Tumbling Age 10/12 Regional Champion.

In National 6 under 13 Yrs, we had 2 tumblers, Morgan Cook scoring 73.50 placing 2<sup>nd</sup> taking Silver home and Bethany Smith scoring 73.65 placing 1<sup>st</sup> taking Gold and claiming the title of National 6 Age under 13 Regional Champion.

The last group to compete of the day at 7.30pm were our National 7's. In the Women's Over 13's saw Clare Stringer compete against one other gymnast. Scoring 72.00 taking the Gold Medal, becoming the National 7 Age over 13's Regional Champion.

In the National 7 Men's Over 13's saw Enrique Pazaran-Butler have a clean sweep on his tumblers scoring 75.15 and taking the Gold Medal becoming the National 7 Over 13's Men's Regional Champion.

Amazing results for all gymnasts who competed. Harlequin took home 18 medals and have 16 gymnasts through to National Semi's at Birmingham Arena in June.
